WILLIAM PATTERSON

William Patterson was one of the twins born on June 10th, 1782 near Hillsborough, Orange County, North Carolina. He traveled with his family to South Carolina, Kentucky and then onto St. Louis County, Missouri arriving in May of 1797.

In 1808 William married Assenath Piggott at her new home in St. Louis County, where she and her mother had just moved.

Assenath Piggott was born on January 17, 1791 in the River front Fort established by her father, Captain James Piggott. Assenath grew up in Illinois directly across the Mississippi River from where the Pattersons lived. Assenath's father, James Piggott, operated a ferry across the Mississippi on an exclusive contract. After his death in 1799, the ferry continued to operate and was the major link between the two sides of the river. His widow, Frances James Piggott had remarried to a Jacob Collard, leased out the ferry business and moved to the Missouri side of the river in St. Louis County.

I have enough information on James Piggott and his family to include a section about the PIGGOTT FAMILY HISTORY in the addendum of this Patterson history. Carl Baldwin wrote a book about Captain James Piggott in 1987 and the man was quite a pioneer. He traveled to the wilderness with Lewis and Clark and established a frontier Fort across the Mississippi from St. Louis that was truly the last bastion of civilization in those days before 1800.

William and Assenath Patterson lived near Florissant in St. Louis County, Missouri. Florissant lies some 15 miles north of the city of St. Louis. He was a farmer all his life.

He served for a brief period in the War of 1812 on the Mississippi River. A copy of the pension file is contained in the addendum. He was in Captain David Music's Militia Company.

William and Assenath remained in St. Louis County for all their lives.

After William Patterson died in 1860, Assenath moved to live with her daughter Lydia Patterson Veale also in the area and remained there until she herself died in November of 1878. Both are buried in the old Cold Water Cemetery in Florissant, Missouri.

The Old Cold Water Cemetery is a part of the Cold Water Creek Baptist Church located on Hall's Ferry Road. I have included a brief history in the Addendum.

William Patterson died on May 25, 1860. Assenath died in 1878 and her stone reads, *'Died November 13, 1878 at 87 years 9 months.'* Both tombstones remain today at the Cold Water Cemetery.

William and Assenath had a total of 15 children, 9 of which lived beyond infancy. These children were all born in St. Louis County, Missouri.

The Children of William Patterson

It has been stated that there were fifteen children and nine survived childhood. I have information on thirteen of these children.

JOSEPH PATTERSON

Joseph Patterson was born on August 27, 1809. He married Mary (Veale) James, a widow, in November 1831. This was her second marriage, his first. They had no children.

Mary died on August 11, 1835 at the still young age of 23 years. Mary Veale James Patterson is buried at Cold Water.

Joseph remarried (Sarah) Sally Patterson, his second cousin, on May 14th, 1837. Sallie was a daughter of John Patterson III and Jane Jamison. She was born in Florissant on December 19, 1820.

Again, there were no children in this marriage either.

Joseph died July 29, 1872 and is buried at Cold Water Cemetery. Sally died May 1, 1901 and is also buried at Cold Water.

KEZIAH PATTERSON

Keziah, named for her grandmother, was born June 28, 1811.

She married Gilbert James in St. Louis County on January 4, 1831. According to his tombstone, Gilbert was born February 25, 1803.

Gilbert James died at age forty two in April 1845. Keziah died November 6, 1854 and both are buried in Coldwater Cemetery.

FRANCES PATTERSON

Frances 'Fanny' Patterson was born in 1814. She was one of the children that died young.

LEMUEL JAMES PATTERSON

Lemuel James Patterson was born near St. Ferdinand Township in St. Louis County, Missouri on June 19, 1816 where he remained until he was 27 years old. During his youth he was a farmer and received a *'common school' education*.

On October 1, 1843 he married Ann Elizabeth Hume in St. Louis, Missouri. The Hume line is our link to Royalty. Ann Elizabeth Hume was in the line to the Throne of Scotland although many generations and many miles removed. A brief HUME FAMILY HISTORY is contained in the addendum.

In 1844, Lemuel and Ann moved to Greene County, Illinois where they resided till their deaths. They first located some 2 miles southwest of Wilmington, where he and George Schutz leased the Hodge Mill, later known as Schutz Mills, on Hurricane Creek. They added a large steam distillery and engaged in an extensive milling and distilling business. They bought thousands of bushels of corn at the rate of 10 cents per bushel.

In 1849 he sold his interest to George Schutz and moved to Wilmington which was later renamed Patterson, Illinois in his honor. Here he engaged in the mercantile business until 1856, when he was elected to the office of Sheriff and moved to Carrollton.

In 1858, at the expiration of his term of office, he moved to his farm near Wilmington. In 1860 he was appointed Postmaster at Wilmington, a position which he held for 22 years. He held the office of Justice of the Peace from 1849 to 1856 and again from 1877 to 1881.

In 1862 he was appointed a government inspector for the District. In 1864 he was elected an Associate Justice and served as a member of the County Commissioners Court.

In 1866 he joined with his son-in-law, John Jones, and bought the mercantile firm of L. D. Morris. He remained with *Jones, Patterson & Company* until it was dissolved in 1871.

In 1882, he rented out his farm and moved to Roodhouse and took charge of the Roodhouse Grange Store. In Roodhouse, he was an alderman and Council member.

Lemuel James and Ann Elizabeth Patterson celebrated their 50th Anniversary in 1893 and remained in Roodhouse until their deaths; his on December 17, 1896 and hers on May 30, 1900. Lemuel James and Ann Elizabeth Patterson had 7 children. The first two were born in St. Louis County, Missouri and the others in Greene County, Illinois.

Minerva Eve Patterson

Minerva Eve Patterson, my ancestor, was born in St. Louis County, Missouri on September 5, 1844. She moved to Wilmington, Illinois when she was three months old.

She married John Jones of Patterson on April 15, 1866 and died in Roodhouse on October 18,

1933.

John Jones, the second of the name, was the eldest child of Josiah Jones and Elizabeth Adelaide Neece. He was born in Wilmington, Greene County, Illinois on December 11, 1839. Wilmington's name was later changed to Patterson in honor of his future wife's family.

John Jones was eighty-nine years old at the time of his death in 1928. Minerva Jones continued on in excellent health until her death in Roodhouse on October 18, 1933 also at the age of eighty-nine years.

John and Minerva Patterson Jones raised a fine family of five children, including a state Supreme Court Justice and my Grandmother.

MINNIE FLORENCE JONES, my grandmother, was born on February 16, 1867 while the family was living in Carrollton. She met my grandfather, Addison Joseph Sharon while she was a school teacher in Carrollton. They were married there on June 14, 1893. Add and Minnie lived their entire lives in Carrollton, Illinois. Minnie and Add had five children, John Jones, Leontine, Lucy May, Joseph and my mother, Almeda Sharon.

NORMAN LEMUEL JONES was born in Patterson, Illinois on September 19, 1870. He was elected State Representative in 1892 and at only twenty two years of age was the youngest member of the Legislature. He was re-elected in 1894. He was elected State's Attorney for Greene County in 1912 and elected Circuit Judge in 1914 to fill a vacancy. He was re-elected in 1915, 1921 and 1927, each time endorsed by both the Republicans and the Democrats at their conventions. He was appointed by the Supreme Court as an Appellate judge and served for ten years during which he became Presiding Justice. In 1924 he was nominated as the Democratic Candidate for Governor of Illinois. He polled the largest vote ever cast for any Democratic candidate. Regretfully it was in a losing cause. In 1931 he was elected to the State Supreme Court in a landslide victory. On June 28, 1906 he was married in Carrollton to Almeda DeKalb Pegram. Norman L. Jones died on November 15, 1940. Meda P. Jones died February 16, 1953.

LUCIE MAE JONES was born in 1872. She married Thomas H. Cobbs of Greene County, Illinois on August 29, 1898 in Roodhouse. They had no children.

CORA M. JONES was born in Roodhouse in 1876 and remained there for her entire life. She married James L. Orr, also of Roodhouse, on January 12, 1907. James Orr worked for the Railroad in that city, and then later for the Roodhouse Bank. They spent all their lives in Roodhouse.

HOWARD KENNETT JONES was born in Roodhouse in 1878. He remained unmarried all his life. Howard worked for the railroad for over forty years. In later life he suffered a stroke and was in ill health. He shot himself and was found dead in his room in the Western Hotel in Chicago, Illinois in January of 1941.

James Lemuel Patterson

James Lemuel Patterson was born in St. Louis County on August 29, 1846. He went to school in Illinois and was a teacher there for nine years.

When his father went to Carrollton as Sheriff, James studied law under Judge Hodges when he was 18 years old. In 1870 he was admitted to the Bar and established his own Law Firm in Roodhouse in 1877.

On March 26, 1868 he married Mary E. Wilmington in a service by his cousin, John Jones, Justice. They had two sons. James died in Roodhouse on June 22, 1899 at the age of 53 while undergoing an operation to have a tumor removed from his neck. Their children were:

Stanton Hume Patterson

Stanton Hume Patterson was born in Greene County in 1848 and was a farmer in that county until his death.

On March 11, 1869 he married America Jane Wilkinson at a service presided over by his brother in law, justice John Jones. Stanton died in Hillview, Illinois on March 31, 1920. America died there September 27, 1917. I have this information on their children:

Maria Frances Patterson

Maria Frances (Fannie) Patterson was born in 1850. On November 28, 1871 she married Samuel F. M. Hicks, his second marriage. Sam died April 5, 1917 and Fannie died June 28, 1923. They had these children:

Joseph William Patterson

Joseph William Patterson was born in 1852 in Patterson, Illinois and was a farmer. He married Ida Margaret (Margie) Groce on March 18, 1887.

Joseph died in Hillview, Illinois on January 17, 1922. They had 4 children:

VIRGINIA PATTERSON married Clarence W. Ballard on December 26, 1912.

LETA PATTERSON married Corbett Whiteman.

FRANCES ELIZABETH PATTERSON married Herman Edwin Teeter of Roodhouse on May 7, 1916. Herman died at age twenty five on August 16, 1918. They only had one child:

Virginia Pauline Teeter born 1917.

HUME PATTERSON a doctor.

George Breckenridge Patterson

George Breckenridge Patterson was born in 1854 and was also a farmer in Greene County.

On March 6, 1879 he married Alice C. Gamble of Carrollton. He died in 1925.

Here is part of a letter to me from Dianne Wells (June 3, 2013): *“Your direct Patterson line, via Minerva Eve Patterson, is tied to mine, via Lemuel James Patterson - specifically George Breckenridge Patterson. George, the son of Lemuel James and Ann Elizabeth Hume, was married to Alice Cora Gamble, which you already know.....this is where my line comes in more clearly. To George Breckenridge and Alice were born (as I know) a son, known to my father as uncle "Lasher" Patterson, and a daughter, Ulah Patterson, who was my father's maternal grandmother. Ulah married Hubert John Morrison in 1902 in St. Louis. To them were born a son, George Malcolm, born in 1903 or 1904 in St. Louis city, a daughter Thyra Alice (my father's mother), born in 1905 in St. Louis . There was also a daughter, Marjorie Etta, or Marjoretta, who died in infancy. As a side note: my dad remembers that as a child, he and his cousins always referred to their grandmother Ulah as "Danny" - don't know where that came from though!*

Ulah Morrison (nee Patterson) was born Sept. 7, 1881 in Roodhouse, Illinois and died on May 29, 1934 in St. Louis, at the age of 52. She had cancer of the colon. This information is found on Missouri Digital Heritage, Missouri Death Certificates online.

If you already know or have seen this information before, I do apologize, but I just wanted to be sure that you at least knew that there were, in fact, children born to George Breckenridge & Alice Cora Patterson!”

Sallie Augusta Patterson

Sallie Augusta Patterson was born November 16, 1867. She died August 3, 1945

I have no other information on Sallie except she never married and lived in Jacksonville, Illinois.

JAMES LEMAN PATTERSON

James 'Doc' Patterson was born in 1818 and never married.

He remained in the St. Louis area and died as a young man at the age of twenty on August 26, 1838. He is buried at the Cold Water Cemetery in Florissant, Missouri.

ELEANOR ANN PATTERSON

Eleanor Ann 'Nellie' Patterson was born February 9, 1820 in St. Louis County.

She Married Solomon Russell on December 7, 1835. Solomon was born in Virginia in 1811.

They remained in Missouri and moved to High Hill, Montgomery County, Missouri. Solomon died there July 22, 1891. Eleanor died there August 28, 1901. They had the following children:

William Robert Russell

William was born August 19, 1837. He married Mary Jane James on April 1, 1852. She was only 12 years old at the time, so the marriage record wasn't actually recorded until June 21, 1858 when she was a tad older. Another source indicates they were actually married in 1858, which seems reasonable as the first child was born in 1859. Also they celebrated their 50th Anniversary in 1908. That was according to his obituary.

Mary Jane was a daughter of William James and Evaline Blackburn, according to her death certificate. She was born in St. Louis County on August 9, 1840.

William died January 4, 1909, and Mary died of Tuberculosis September 16, 1910, both in St. Louis County. They are buried in the Cold Water Cemetery,

Their children were:

WILLIAM HENRY RUSSELL born February 26, 1859 and died April 24, 1906. He married Florence R. Hayes.

GEORGE EDWARD RUSSELL born December 11, 1860, and died November 17, 1940 in Collinsville, Madison County, Illinois. He married Katie Austerhoff May 9, 1891 in St. Louis. She was born in Germany in 1868 and died in the early 1900s. George then married Eva Marie Haddock. Eva was born in Kentucky May 19, 1871 and died in St. Clair County, Illinois August 17, 1937.

JOHN ROBERT RUSSELL born February 1, 1864 and died October 5, 1865.

CHARLES SOLOMON RUSSELL born June 10, 1867 and died February 17, 1947 in Ozark, Missouri. He married Emma Birdie Huffman in St. Louis June 13, 1894.

ROBERT LEE RUSSELL born November 14, 1869, and died July 10, 1921 in Koch, Missouri. He married Dorothy 'Dolly' S. Britt January 6, 1898. He later married a Jane someone.

JOSEPH EUGENE RUSSELL born July 19, 1872, and died in St. Louis May 26, 1933.
He married Mary Jane Layten.

MARY EVELINE RUSSELL born November 28, 1874 and died September 16, 1876.

Sarah Russell

LYDIA ROGERS PATTERSON

Lydia Rogers Patterson was born February 9, 1822. She married Jacob Veale in 1840.

Jacob Veale was born on September 16, 1818 in Cornwall, Wales, England and was a son of Richard Veale and Temperance Rowe. They were early settlers in Pike County, Missouri.

They remained in St. Louis County through the 1870 census and then moved to Barton County, Missouri in time for the 1880 census.

Jacob Veale died March 9, 1886 in Barton County, Missouri. Lydia died in Barton County in 1910. Both are buried in the Howell, Missouri Cemetery.

They had 9 children:

Richard was born March 2, 1843 never married and died in 1922 in Iuntha, Barton County, Missouri.

William Patterson Veale

William Veale was born August 29, 1845. He married Ruth Grigg Barnes in December 1875. Ruth was born June 13, 1855. She was a daughter of Flanders Calloway Barnes and Oidience Grigg.

The family moved to Kansas and William Veale died in Pittsburgh, Crawford County Kansas on August 28, 1942. Ruth had died back on November 26, 1903.

CORA MELCINA VEALE was born in 1876 and died in 1878.

EDGAR ROGERS VEALE was born December 9, 1877 and died in an electrical accident in Phoenix, Arizona August 30, 1929. He married Edna (Llewellyn) Ellaby July 18, 1920. She was a daughter of Harrison Llewellyn and the widow of Keller Ellaby. She was born December 27, 1879, and died April 3, 1964. They had two children:

LAURA CALLOWAY VEALE was born October 2, 1879 and died December 30, 1883.

ARTHUR BERRYMAN VEALE was born May 26, 1881 and died March 22, 1935 in Santa Paula, California. He married Emma Hild on June 15, 1913. Emma was born April 27, 1890 and died December 9, 1982. They had two children:

India Ruth Veale born April 17, 1914. She married Kenneth Malcolm Kelley on November 11, 1939. She died February 23, 1981.

Carl William Veale born June 21, 1916. He married Mary Louise LeSeur on June 10, 1946. He died February 11, 1987.

NELLIE DOUGLAS VEALE was born November 29, 1882 and died January 5, 1884.

HUGH FORREST VEALE was born December 10, 1883. He never married and was killed in France in the First World War on October 4, 1918.

LUCY TEMPERANCE VEALE was born December 1, 1886 and died August 2, 1919 in Iantha, Missouri. She married John Percy January 10, 1909. Their children were:

Betty Fay Percy born in 1918 and unmarried.

WILLA MAE VEALE was born May 14, 1888. She married John Albert Chester April 18, 1917. John died March 2, 1940 and Willa Mae died November 24, 1973. Their children were:

John Albert Chester born in 1920 served in WWII.

Mary Loretta Chester born 1923 and married Chester Allen Hanna.

FANNIE FERN VEALE was born November 22, 1890 and died June 18, 1930. She married John Henry McCrea March 26, 1917. They had two daughters:

Gertrude Patricia McCrea born October 31, 1922 and married Irvane T. Burris and lived in Ventura, California.

THOMAS FINNEY VEALE was born May 1, 1893 and died from a poison accident on January 27, 1894.

HOWARD HALEY VEALE was born January 6, 1895 and died unmarried at age 18 on February 6, 1913 in Barton, Missouri.

Mary was born June 29, 1847 and died April 1, 1918. She married Sidney Wilmington on February 28, 1867. He was born in 1841 and died in 1905. They died in Patterson, Greene County, Illinois.

GRADY QUENTIN VEALE was born February 9, 1905 and died in a Japanese Prison Camp at Bataan in the Philippines in 1942 during the first part of WWII.

PHYLLIS OLGA VEALE was born in 1908.

Joseph Piggott Veale

Joseph was born February 6, 1855. He married Emma Hill.
