THE HUME FAMILY

The Hume Family is our tie to nobility. I have charts going back as far as Sir Thomas Hume of Hume, eldest son of Sir John Hume. This takes us back to about the year 1000 which is probably further than most of us really care to go.

Sir Thomas Hume was thirteenth in the direct male line from Crinian, Lord of the Isles, who was slain in 1045. This line, which is that of the Earls of Dunbar, is given in Paul's Scots Peerage III, Page 239.

A rather extensive History of the Hume Family was put together in 1903 by John Robert Hume of St. Louis, Missouri. Most of the early line is extracted from that work.

The Hume Family home was Wedderburn Castle in Scotland. It was here in Wedderburn that the Hume who came to America was born. This brief genealogy begins with George Hume who came to America in the early 1700s.

Our American line went from George Hume to George Hume II to John Hume to Stanton Hume who married Sarah Breckenridge. Their daughter, Ann Elizabeth Hume married Lemuel James Patterson in St. Louis County, Missouri. This is the connection of the Hume line with my mother's Patterson line, and how they became a part of my direct lineage.

GEORGE HUME

George Hume was born at Wedderburn Castle in Scotland on May 30, 1698. Together with his father, Sir George, and his uncle Francis, he participated in the Jacobite rebellion of 1715.

The Jacobites were supporters of the Stuart claim to the throne of England after the expulsion of James II in 1688. They supported James son, Prince James Francis Edward. When the Stuarts were defeated in Battle by the English the Humes were stripped of their power and made to pay for supporting the losing side.

George's uncle, Sir Francis Hume was banished to the colonies in 1715. Sir Francis died a few years later. After two years in prison, George Hume was deported to join him in Virginia. George's cousin was the Colonial Governor Spottswood in Williamsburgh. Governor Spottswood had remained loyal to the Crown and young George Hume was placed under his care.

George Hume arrived in Virginia in 1721 and in 1723 became a royal surveyor. In 1727-28, he laid out the present city of Fredericksburg, Virginia.

George served as a lieutenant in the Colonial Troops of Spottsylvania County under Captain William Bledsoe. He produced his commission in open court and took oath on September 2, 1729. This service will entitle descendants to membership in the Society of Colonial Dames and the Society of Colonial Wars.

On February 16, 1727 George Hume married Elizabeth Proctor, daughter of George and Mary

Proctor. Elizabeth was living in Fredericksburg in Spotsylvania County while George was establishing his reputation as a surveyor here.

In 1731 George Hume received his commission as Deputy to the King and with a marriage dower of 2,000 acres he and his family took up residence in Fredericksburg, Virginia.

From the ages of 16 to 18, George Washington studied surveying as an apprentice under George Hume in Fredericksburg.

George, like all the Humes, was an Episcopalian and was a vestryman in St. George's Parish. George was King's surveyor for Lord Fairfax from 1743 to 1750 in Orange County, Virginia. The latter part of his life was spent in Culpeper where he was surveyor during the 1750s. George Hume died in Culpeper which at the time was in Madison County, Virginia in 1760.

George and Elizabeth Hume had six children: GEORGE HUME JR., Francis, John, William, James and Charles Hume. The following is what I know of these children.

George Hume II

George Hume the second was born in Culpeper County, Virginia in 1729. In 1754, he married Jane Stanton, the daughter of Thomas Stanton. This is my lineage, and the life of George Hume II is covered in the next section.

Francis Hume

Francis was the second son. He was born about 1730 in Culpeper County and was a farmer there until his death in 1813. He married Elizabeth Duncan August 13, 1763 in Fauquier County Virginia. She died in about 1822 at the home of her daughter Nancy Hume Sharp in Boone County, Missouri at the age of 94.

Francis served in the French & Indian War with Captain John Field. He also served with Field in the American Revolution. He received bounty lands in Culpeper County for this service in 1811.

Francis and Elizabeth had two daughters and four sons:

ELIZABETH HUME who married John Almond of Spotsylvania County.

NANCY HUME who married Lewis Sharp of Culpeper.

JAMES HUME who married Catherine Barnes on October 2, 1797.

ARMISTEAD HUME who married Priscilla Colvin on December 25, 1798. He died in Culpeper County January 19, 1815. Priscilla then married the Reverend Abner Baughan on November 17, 1817.

CHARLES HUME who married Celia Shumate on June 1, 1803. He was in Fauquier County, Virginia when he served in the War of 1812, and was commissioned an officer. He served with his cousin, Joseph Hume and was discharged at Fredericksburg on December 17, 1814. He moved to Madison County, Kentucky in 1818. The majority of

the lands were in Madison County, but the house itself was in Garrard County. In the early 1820s they moved to Trimble County, Kentucky on the Ohio River. He lived there until his death in 1838 or 1839. Their children were:

James Armistead Hume born about 1804 in Fauquier County. He married Mary Nicholson and died young without children. Mary remarried and went west.

Sarah Elizabeth Hume was born November 8, 1808. She married Zachary Taylor, a cousin of the President on January 13, 1830. She lived into her eighties.

Lewis Hume a Reverend. He was born in Fauquier County on June 22, 1814. He switched from the Episcopalian faith to the Scotch Presbyterian and became a minister in that church in Louisville, Kentucky. He married Lamira Douglas McGee on June 6, 1843. He died in Spencer County, Kentucky on his farm on May 22, 1888. Lamira died there on May 22, 1886 exactly two years before her husband.

Lucinda Hume was born about 1824 and died unmarried February 2, 1895.

Joseph Squires Hume was born November 14, 1827. He married Sarah Ann McGee in March 1854. He was a physician. He died June 4, 1860. Sarah was born February 14, 1828 and died August 17, 1902.

Emily Hume was born June 8, 1830. She married Charles Norwood on February 15, 1846. She died January 13, 1893.

John Hume was born in Garrard County, Kentucky. He married Ellen Snyder.

BENJAMIN HUME who married Nelly Frost.

John Hume

John Hume was born in 1732. At age eleven, he was taken by his uncle, Captain James Hume, and placed in the British Navy. He studied in Norfolk and went with his uncle to sea.

He returned to America and married Helinor Manson in Boston in 1766. He was involved as an *Indian* in the famous Boston Tea Party of December 16, 1773. After the Revolution, he moved to the area of Waterville, Maine (still part of Massachusetts at the time) and remained there the rest of his life.

James and Helinor had three sons and four daughters:

JOHN HUME who married Nancy Webb.

GEORGE HUME who was killed in the War of 1812.

CAPT. WILLIAM HUME, who married Augusta Jackman.

ELINOR HUME who married a Simpson.

DAUGHTER who married a Crosby.

DAUGHTER who married a Winn.

DAUGHTER who married a McCusic.

William Hume

William was born in Fredericksburg, Virginia in about 1734. He studied law in Virginia, and in 1754 married a Granville girl from South Carolina.

They had two sons:

ALEXANDER HUME who was a lieutenant in the Second South Carolina regiment and was killed in one of the first battles in the American Revolutionary War. He was killed at Savannah on October 9, 1777 on the second day after he enlisted in the Army. He was not married.

JOHN HUME was possibly the eldest child. He married a Long from Massachusetts and they had two sons, both of whom died as children. His first wife died. He then married Jeane Glenn and moved to Long Run, Kentucky in about 1783. John became ill and wrote his will in 1798 and died in 1802. Their children were:

John Hume was killed in a skirmish with Indians in Kentucky as a young teenager.

William Hume died of small pox as a child in 1790.

Sarah Hume married Thomas Sturgeon on April 11, 1786. Both died in 1845. They had 5 sons and 5 daughters.

A Daughter who married Christian Young.

After his first wife died, William returned to the Virginia frontier and married Susan Elzephan of Charleston, South Carolina. He ran a store for a number of years and they had five sons and a daughter:

Rev. GEORGE HUME was born in Culpeper, Virginia in October 1755. He worked with his father in their store up to the Revolution. He enlisted with his father and was made Chaplain of his Regiment. He served in that capacity until the end of the War and was discharged in 1781. He was ordained a minister in the Baptist church and married a cousin, Elizabeth Proctor in 1781. He went west into Kentucky with his family. They settled in Harrodsburg and then moved north to Campbell County, Kentucky. Elizabeth died in 1797 and George married Susan Hutchinson in 1799. Susan died in 1819 and at an old and infirm age, George married a third time and died three months later in 1821. His children were:

Anna Hume born in Virginia in 1781. She married Edward Stephens and died in 1855.

John Hume born in Virginia in 1782. He married Elizabeth Coleman in 1801 and had ten children. After her death he married Susan McKenzie and had one more child. He died in 1845.

William Hume was born in Harrodsburg, Kentucky March 30, 1786. He became a well known preacher. It was said his voice could be heard for two miles on a still night. He married Elizabeth Aldrich in Boone County on October 29, 1807 and lived in Kenton County, Kentucky. He died of cholera on July 8, 1849. Elizabeth was born July 10, 1791 and died March 12, 1877. They had ten children.

Katherine Hume

Aquilla Hume was born in Kentucky in 1790. He married Mary Baylor February 28, 1811 and moved to Rush County, Indiana and they had nine children.

Lewis Hume born August 8, 1793 in Kenton County, Kentucky. He seems to have been 'albino' with white hair and almost white eyes. He was taken by Indians, but returned two days later. He married Mary 'Polly' Roberts on January 21, 1818. They lived in

Kentucky until 1832 when they moved to Dearborn County Indiana. He later went to Rush County with his brother Aquilla Hume and settled in Moscow, Indiana in 1836. They moved to Jasper County, Illinois in 1854 and in 1860 moved to Sullivan County, Indiana where he died December 23, 1875. Polly died there September 15, 1873.

Phoebe Hume born in 1795. Married a Rice.

Agnes Hume born in 1796.

Infant Hume born and died in 1797.

Elizabeth Hume was born near Blue Licks, Campbell County, Kentucky on February 4, 1801. She married James Moroney in Dearborn County, Indiana on January 1, 1817. They had eleven children. She died on December 9, 1871 in Shelby County, Indiana.

George Hume was born October 6, 1806 and married Lucinda Powell in Wilmington, Indiana. He died and Lucinda married a Smith, was divorced and married Aquilla Aldridge, a steamboat captain on the Ohio River.

Sarah Hume

ELZEPHAN HUME was born in 1756. He married Sarah Sleet in about 1790 in Losantiville (now the city of Cincinnati), Ohio at the fort in that town. She was a daughter of Weeden Sleet. He was acting as a surveyor in setting up the city at that time. About 1800 they returned to Big Bone Creek in Boone County, Kentucky. He served in the War of 1812 with Harrison and then returned to Big Bone where he remained until his death in 1831. They had six sons and two daughters:

Stripling B. Hume born in 1791.

Leroy Preston Hume born in 1791.

Weeden S. Hume born in 1795.

John Sleet Hume born in 1797, died 1874. He married Mary Howe, born 1799 and died 1832.

George W. Hume born 1801 and died 1845. He married Pauline B. Connelley, born 1805 and died 1847.

William Hume born 1803.

Eupha Hume born in 1805. She married Baldwin B. Bane March 27, 1828

A Daughter born in 1807. No other information.

JARRED (GERALD) HUME was born in 1760 and became a camp boy with General Anthony Wayne at age 15 as he was too young to fight. As he became old enough, he was promoted to Major on Wayne's staff and served for the entire war. He married at age forty-five to Mary Aldridge in 1805 in Harrison County, Kentucky. He was a surveyor and then received a grant for 2000 acres. Through a mistake, he settled on the wrong property and lost everything. This caused his death in about 1811. They had three children:

Joel Hume was born in Campbell (now Kenton) County, Kentucky on June 13, 1807 and he died March 29, 1891. He married Malinda Dusky in Indiana and they moved to Parke County, Indiana. He was ordained a Baptist Preacher in Vermillion County, Indiana. In 1840 he moved to Farmersville, Posey County, Indiana. Malinda died in Poseyville on October 10, 1854. They had ten children. On August 20, 1856 he married Frances 'Fannie' Yeager, 26 years younger than he was.

Elizabeth Hume married an Armstrong.

Jared Banks Hume who moved to Memphis and died there in 1861.

PATRICK HUME was born in 1776 in Virginia. He married Elizabeth Coleman and had six children before she died in 1825 in Dearborn County, Indiana. He died in Marion County, Indiana in 1837.

ELIZABETH HUME married a Coleman and lived in Lexington, Kentucky.

William Hume fought in the Revolution for the Colonies and while away his wife Susan died.

In 1782, he married for the third time to a widow named Sarah Baker. One source says there were no children, another source says there were four more children, I'll list them just in case, though I have no information:

JOSEPH HUME

JEFFERSON HUME

PRICE B. HUME

William went to Kentucky for a time and returned to Virginia in 1805 for a visit. While there he married for the fourth time. He married another widow, Sarah Benson of Fauquier County, Virginia. They had one child:

JOEL BENSON HUME

They then returned to Campbell County, Kentucky. William Hume died of pneumonia from the cold mountain crossing in 1809.

James Hume

James was born in Culpeper on February 25, 1740. After his father died in 1760, he traveled to Cumberland County, Pennsylvania where there was a large Jacobite Community.

There he met and wed Frances Patterson in 1781. They lived the rest of their lives in East Pennsboro Township, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania. As an aside, my Sharon family lived there in the 1750s.

James Hume died in East Pennsboro in June 1811 and his widow, Frances, died there in 1841.

They had twelve children:

ANNA HUME born April 17, 1782 and married to Adam Swiler in Philadelphia.

MARY HUME born in 1784 and died unmarried in 1801.

SAMUEL HUME born in 1785 and died in 1857 in Cumberland County.

ROBERT HUME born in 1787 and died a child in 1791.

ISABELLA HUME born in 1788 and married to John McClintock and died in Cumberland County in 1864.

WILLIAM HUME born in 1790, married Sarah Ann Gilson, and died in Marion, Ohio in 1856.

JAMES HUME born in 1793, died in 1864. He married Miss McWilliams in Ohio and then Miss Cambell in Indiana.

FRANCES JANE HUME born in 1794 and died in 1821.

ANDREW HUME born in 1796 and died in 1875.

JANE HUME born in 1798 and died in 1821.

JOHN HUME born in 1800 and died in 1881.

DAVID HUME born in 1802 and died in 1868.

Charles Hume

Charles was born on October 7, 1739 and he married Hannah James in about 1765.

He died in Madison County, Virginia on April 7, 1821.

Charles Hume died on April 7, 1821 and Hannah died on May 15, 1815. They are buried side by side in Oak Park, Virginia.

Charles and Hannah had twelve children, one dying in childbirth. They were:

JOHN HUME born May 21, 1766.

ANNIE HUME born February 7, 1768.

BENJAMIN HUME born February 11, 1770.

GEORGE HUME born November 7, 1771.

ELIZABETH HUME born December 1, 1773.

JOSEPH HUME born September 1, 1775.

HUMPHREY HUME born July 12, 1777.

ROBERT HUME born May 2, 1779.

WILLIAM WALTER HUME born September 10, 1781.

CHARLES HUME born August 16, 1783.

HANNAH HUME born July 12, 1785.

GEORGE HUME II

George Hume the second was born at Culpeper, Virginia in 1729. He married Jane Stanton, daughter of Thomas Stanton in Culpeper in 1754. He had been his father's assistant surveyor as early as the 1750s. As he was the eldest, he carried on the tradition. He was also Administrator of his father's estate when it was finally settled in 1775.

George was known in family circles as *Virginia George* as opposed to his son, *Kentucky George*.

He was a sergeant in the First Virginia Regiment under Colonel George Gibson during the American Revolutionary War serving from September 14, 1777 to March, 1778.

George died in Culpeper in 1802 and his wife died there earlier, but the date of her death is not known.

George and Jane Hume had the following children: George, Reuben, Charles, William, JOHN, Elizabeth, Frances and Sarah Hume. The following is what I know about them.

George Hume III

'Kentucky George' was born on May 21, 1759. He married Susannah Crigler about 1782 or 1783. Susannah was born on January 3, 1762 and was the daughter of Christopher and Catherine (Finks) Crigler of Culpeper.

For more on her family, please see THE CRIGLER FAMILY HISTORY, which follows.

George died in Culpeper County in 1816. I do not know when Susannah died.

George and Susannah had the following children:

JENNIE HUME born about 1784 who married William Finks.

THOMAS HUME born on February 21, 1785. He married Mary Helen Thomas on June 12, 1828.

LARKIN HUME born in 1788 and married in 1812 to Nancy Moberly in Kentucky. He died in 1835.

STANTON HUME born September 12, 1790, died February 13, 1853 and married Susannah Miller on October 30, 1821.

KATHERINE HUME married William Duncan.

Reuben Hume

Reuben was born in 1772 and he married Anna Finks in Culpeper on February 23, 1796.

Anna Finks was born in Culpeper County, Virginia on November 6, 1773. She was a daughter of Mark Finks Junior and Eve Fisher. More on the FINKS FAMILY will be found elsewhere in this addenda.

He moved to Madison County, Kentucky. He died there in 1821.

In 1823, his wife Anna moved with some children to Boone County, Missouri where she died on July 30, 1839 near Rocheport, Missouri.

The children of Reuben and Anna Hume were:

JOEL HUME born November 18, 1796 in Culpeper County, Virginia. He married Polly Ann Peyton November 6, 1822 and died in Howard County, Missouri November 27, 1864. Polly Ann was born in Madison County, Kentucky August 6, 1806. She died May 12, 1885. They had eight children in Kentucky before going to Missouri. He eventually owned over 2000 acres of farmland. He supported the South in the Civil War and three of his sons fought in the CSA. Union supporters burned his house down. He was arrested and imprisoned in Glasgow Prison and sentenced to be shot as a Southern Supporter. As he was take to be shot, he suffered a stroke and was returned to prison and then later released. He died soon afterwards. The children were:

Reuben Yelverton Hume born October 3, 1826 in Madison County, Kentucky. He married Francis Ann Peyton in Randolph County, Missouri on November 26, 1846. He died in Richmond, Ray County, Missouri on August 27, 1919. Frances was born in Madison County on November 3, 1830 and died in Ray County, Missouri on January 4, 1911. They had six children.

Aramander (Amanda) Hume born July 24, 1824 in Madison County, Kentucky. She married Lindsey Carson Peyton on September 12, 1838 in Madison County. She died in Howard County, Missouri on February 26, 1905, he died there on January 19, 1907.

Jesse Payton Hume born October 8, 1829 and died in Howard County, Missouri on July 25, 1856.

John C. Hume born January 1, 1831 and died January 11, 1892.

Ann Elizabeth Hume born September 25, 1833 and died in Howard County, Missouri on September 5, 1845 at age twelve.

Susan Jane Hume born February 28, 1836 and died August 23, 1897. She first married William Hayes on March 29, 1853 and later married Francis Marion Colvin on December 15, 1868.

Joel L. Hume born September 7, 1838 and died January 12, 1891. He married Louisa Lea or Lee on April 17, 1872.

George C. Hume born October 19, 1840 in Madison County, Kentucky and died in Howard County, Missouri on May 2, 1857. He did not marry and died at age seventeen.

Nancy Mildred Hume born June 12, 1845 in Howard County, Missouri and died two months later on August 13, 1845.

William S. Hume born September 5, 1847 and died a few months later on October 20, 1847.

REUBEN HUME born October 6, 1798 in Virginia. He married Elizabeth Sharp and died in 1850 in Cole County, Missouri. They had seven children:

John L. Hume married Cena Johnson. They had two children.

Joseph F. Hume married Kate McNair. They had six children.

James Hume married Catherine Taylor and had three sons.

Louisa Hume married James Gray and had three children.

Nancy Hume married William Stephens.

Reuben Hume married Elizabeth (Lizzie) Conley.

Harriet Hume married Joseph Hart and had six children.

GEORGE HUME born October 15, 1800 married Harriet Ann McBain in Boone County, Missouri on June 28, 1824 and died there March 4, 1863. Harriet was born April 5, 1802 and died in Boone County on June 25, 1843. They had two sons:

Lewis Hume married Eliza Jane Colvin on July 11, 1850. He died three years after his marriage on February 23, 1854 and had a son and a daughter.

George Hume was born February 20, 1838. He never married and was alive in 1903 when the HUME HISTORY was written.

LEWIS HUME born September 12, 1803 and married Henrietta Monroe McBain in Madison County, Kentucky in 1823 and moved to Boone County, Missouri where he died on December 23, 1870. Henrietta died on November 28, 1905 at the age of 106 years! This is from her tombstone. Henrietta was a grand niece of President James Monroe. Their children were:

Reuben Hume born April 15, 1824. He first married Catherine Estes and had one daughter. He later married Henrietta Wilson on August 23, 1857. There were no children in the second marriage.

George Hume was born in 1826. He married Mary Jane Palmer on January 24, 1850. He died July 29, 1891. He had three sons.

James Robert Hume was born October 18, 1829 and died April 28, 1881. He married Sallie Booth and had six children.

Sidney Hume was born October 25, 1831. He married twice, first to Tabitha McBain and second to Sallie Austin.

Lafayette Hume was born July 18, 1833 and died October 19, 1898. He married Samira Hickam on May 26, 1857 and had five sons.

Ann Elizabeth Hume was born February 5, 1842. She married Scott Hickam on April 6, 1871.

THORNTON HUME born June 9, 1807 and married Louisa Sharp in January 1828 and died in Boone County, Missouri on April 6, 1866. Their nine children were:

James C. Hume was born in Boone county and *'Perished on the plains in New Mexico.'*

John F. Hume was born December 27, 1829 and died in 1870. He married Elizabeth Martin in 1869.

Oliver Hume was born February 7, 1833. He married Nannie Jamison in Clay County, Missouri.

Thornton Hume Jr. was born November 17, 1834 and died within a month.

Ann Hume was born March 18, 1837. She married G. W. Anthony on July 6, 1861.

Sarah Bennett Hume was born December 4, 1838. She married William Drew in Clay County in 1859.

Elizabeth Hume was born March 4, 1840 and died February 8, 1901. She married Jacob Hyder in 1867.

Joseph Hume a twin born February 14, 1843 and died in infancy.

William Hume the other twin born February 14, 1843 and died as a teenager on October 1, 1855.

JOHN FINKS HUME born April 9, 1809 in Madison County, Kentucky, married to Nancy Sharp in Boone County, Missouri on February 17, 1831 and died in Moniteua County, Missouri in 1890.

STANTON HUME born in Kentucky on January 12, 1812 and died unmarried in Boone County, Missouri on August 5, 1842.

Charles Hume

Charles was born in Culpeper and married Elizabeth Banks in 1785. She was the daughter of Adam and Grace (James) Banks.

They had the following children:

POLLY HUME

SIMPSON HUME

ELIZABETH HUME who married a Taylor.

HENRY HUME

Elizabeth died and Charles remarried to Elizabeth Kirtley on March 25, 1800.

They had the following children:

SALLY HUME born June 11, 1801.

WILLIAM HUME born September 1, 1802.

JOHN MILTON HUME born September 19, 1804.

NEWTON J. HUME born November 12, 1806.

JAMES H. HUME born March 12, 1809.

ALFRED HUME born April 11, 1811.

MARY JANE HUME born September 17, 1813.

SUSAN HUME born May 29, 1816.

HENRIETTA HUME born November 3, 1818.

William Hume

William was born in Culpeper, but I have no information on him.

There was a family of Humes in Pike County, Missouri in the early 1800s. A descendent only can get back as far as a George Thomas Hume who married Jane M. Walmsley on December 12, 1853.

This William Hume is the only possible I can figure out that may have gone to Pike County.

William Patterson also went to Pike County in 1818 and as these families stuck around each other, the two Bills may just have gone together. I can figure out no other connection.

A record shows that he had a son:

Charles Hume born September 7, 1802. I know nothing more.

John Hume

John was born on August 12, 1769 in Madison County, Virginia. He married Anna Crigler on January 5, 1792 and died in St. Louis County, Missouri on September 18, 1842.

This is my direct lineage. The life of John Hume is covered in the next section.

Frances Hume

Frances was born in Virginia and married Joseph Delaney.

They had two daughters and one son.

Elizabeth Hume

I know nothing of Elizabeth Hume at all.

Sarah Hume

Sarah Hume was born in Madison County, Virginia in 1767. She married John Crigler on December 25, 1789.

For more on the Criglers, see the upcoming CRIGLER FAMILY HISTORY.

They had eight children in Madison County, Kentucky where she died on September 14, 1839

The children were:

JENNIE CRIGLER who married James Gillaspy.

ELIZABETH CRIGLER who married Adam Wood.

KATHERINE CRIGLER who married John Wilhoit.

FRANCES CRIGLER who married William McWilliams.

POLLY CRIGLER who married Madison Colvin.

JOHN HUME

John was born August 12, 1769 in Madison County, Virginia and died September 18, 1842 in St. Louis County, Missouri.

He married Anna Crigler also of Madison County on January 5, 1792. She was born July 6, 1771 and died in St. Louis County, Missouri on January 25, 1841.

She was the daughter of Christopher Crigler and Catherine Finks Crigler. For an account of this family, see THE CRIGLER FAMILY HISTORY which follows.

They moved from Madison County in Virginia to Madison County in Kentucky about 1802 or 1803. In 1817 they again moved to St. Louis County in Missouri.

AMANDA BERNOID HUME, born on March 3, 1824. She married Leveret Barker Stowe on November 4, 1843 and died December 9, 1893. Leveret was born in Log City, New Jersey on February 17, 1813 and he died in 1894. Their children were:

Moriah Hume

She was born December 6, 1794 and died June 12, 1839. Moriah married Judge Frederick Hyatt of Florissant, Missouri. After she died, Fred had four more wives, and most were Humes or Breckenrides, all kinfolk. He was obviously a good friend of the family. Fixed speeding tickets and the likes I am sure.

There were six children in the marriage, and no more after this one.

JOHN H. HYATT born May 29, 1815. He married Pamela Clark Musick on April 30, 1840. He died March 30, 1907. Their children were:

JOSEPH LAFAYETTE HYATT born December 23, 1824 and died October 1, 1896. He married first Elizabeth Harris in 1858 and later Martha Cason.

JAMES STANTON HYATT born January 17, 1829 and died July 12, 1879. He married Sarah Patterson.

Martha Hume

Martha was the second wife of Judge Frederick Hyatt after her sister died.

She later died and the good Judge married three more times, including one of my Patterson cousins. The other wives of Frederick Hyatt were all widows. Wife three was Mrs. Ann G. Whistler widow of General Whistler. Four was Mildred (Mellon) Latimer and finally Elizabeth Breckenridge, the widow of Thomas Ferguson.

Stanton Hume

Stanton Hume was born in Madison County, Virginia on May 12, 1799. He married Sarah Ann Breckenridge in Missouri on December 31, 1822 and died in St. Louis County, Missouri on February 18, 1850.

STANTON HUME

Stanton was born in Madison County, Virginia on May 12, 1799 and he died February 18, 1850 in St. Louis County, Missouri.

On December 31, 1822, he married Sarah Ann Breckenridge of St. Louis County. They were married in Florissant. Sarah was born on January 22, 1804 and she died on July 23, 1888. A BRECKENRIDGE FAMILY HISTORY follows this section.

Stanton and Sarah Ann Hume lived in the Patterson Settlement some 15 miles north of the present City of St. Louis and farmed the land all their lives. Both Stanton and Sarah Ann are buried in the Cold Water Cemetery near Florissant, Missouri.

They had twelve children all of whom were born in Florissant, St. Louis County, Missouri. The following is what I know about the family of Stanton Hume and Sarah Breckenridge Hume.
